- 10. Will the school be supportive if my child or family encounter difficulties?





Signpost, facilitate, recommend and support external professional agency involvement. May include services such as: EWEL, CAMHS, SEND and inclusion services, EHR from OP Harbour, Humankind, emotional resilience nurse, Communication and Interaction Team, Cognition and Learning Team, alternative provision

Targeted academic support, social skills groups, CLA wellbeing mentor, learning support department, Attendance and Welfare Manager, young carers designated support teacher, enhanced transition programme, school counsellor, wellbeing mentor, mid-year transfer student support, restorative conversation and practice, Lydia Inclusion Centre, revision sessions, Intervention programmes academic and pastoral, homework support, bespoke curriculum support, targeted pastoral support, peer tutoring, peer mentoring, pre-school support sessions, social times support, sessions and activities, SEND and Inclusion services guidance implemented by teaching staff, student support, managing 'big' feelings, behaviour support centre workshops. Time out at partner school behaviour support centre, family liaison, class/set moves, attendance support, academic mentor, trace forms to support various issues, zones of regulation, student support conversation, small group support during form time

Form period every morning, consistent form tutors and form class, consistent Year Leader and Assistant Year Leader, safe areas for social times, supervised by experienced duty team where students can play and socialise, led by senior members of leadership group. Breakfast, break and lunch hot and cold food offer, kindness lockers, uniform provision, core offer of extra-curricular activities, educational visits, 8am access to school site supervised by qualified staff, locker facility, attendance rewards and celebration breakfasts, experienced subject and pastoral specialists, DEAR programmes, qualified staff to administer defibrillator should the need arise. Preschool quiet club, Lunch club, Behaviour support centre, CEAIG programme for every year group, safeguarding trained cleaning and supervisory teams, cohort noticeboards and newsletters, PHSE/RHSE offer, Microsoft Teams sites for every subject and every pupil, meet and greet every day with experienced key adults, form rep student voice, qualified first aiders on site. Headteacher Friday Bulletin, inclusive QFT methods, transition support programmes between every Key Stage, active and successful House system, regular assemblies, wellbeing programme.
