

Activity Survey 2022 - Destinations of Year 11 Leavers during 2022/2023

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Durham Johnston School



Report Summary

This report shows the destinations of 5,511 Year 11 students who completed statutory education in June 2022.

51.4% of the cohort were male compared to 48.3% female. A small 0.3% withheld their gender or were classified as 'other'.

This report shows that the proportion of the 2022 cohort choosing full time education has reduced to 86.9%, compared to 87.0% in 2021 and 88.4% in 2020.

The proportion securing a place in full time training with independent private providers reduced to 0.8%, compared to 1.2% in 2021.

Overall participation in learning rates have seen a continuous reduction from 93.9% in 2020 to 92.9% in 2022.

Overall participation in education, employment and training rates have seen a small reduction to 95.2%, compared to 95.4% in 2020.

The proportion of the cohort who are not in education, employment or training (NEET) is 3.1% - this compares to 2.9% in 2021 and 3.2% in 2020.

A small 1.1% of the cohort could not be confirmed in a new destination (categorised as 'Not Known').

4.2% of the cohort are either NEET or Not Known - this proportion remains unchanged over the previous three years.

Sustainment Period Key Messages

From November 2022 to February 2023, participation has reduced from 92.9% to 91.0%

New Re-engagement provision via DurhamWorks has resulted in proportion increasing from 0.3% to 1.8%

Overall Education, Employment, Training rates remain relatively static between 95.2% and 95.3%

Employment without training has increased from 1.9% to 2.3% between November and February

NEET rates have reduced from 3.1% to 2.8% between November and February

Summary

Priority Groups

Page 7 of this report shows the breakdown of destinations for key priority groups within the total 5,511 leavers cohort.

Due to the support characteristics and barriers of these groups of young people, we can see their participation in education, employment or training rates are lower than the cohort average.

Conversely their NEET rates are therefore higher.

Area Breakdown

Page 8 of this report shows the area comparisons for County Durham. We have four key delivery areas (geographical breakdowns are on page 10). Total Education, Employment and Training (EET) rates are higher in the East, Mid-Durham and North delivery areas, but 0.5% lower in the South (this is compared to the County Durham average of 95.2%).

The North area is the only delivery area where NEET rates are lower than the county average (2.9% in North Durham compared to 3.1% countywide).

Support is offered via DurhamWorks for all young people who have not secured a place in education, employment or training. More information can be found on the DurhamWorks website (<https://durhamworks.info>).

Support from DurhamWorks Programme for Schools (DWPfs)

1,154 of 2021/2022 Year 11 students were supported by DurhamWorks Programme for Schools (DWPfs) to aid their successful progression, and eventual sustainment, in a positive destination. This is 20.9% of the total cohort of Year 11s

1,022 of the 1,154 (88.6%) were confirmed in a positive post 16 destination on 1st November 2022

The majority of this group (929 or 80.5%) progressed to full time education or training

Other destinations included 43 (3.7%) into employment with accredited training (including apprenticeships); 40 (3.5%) into other employment or education.

These young people were identified and agreed to benefit from additional progression support through tools such as Risk of NEET Indicators (RONI) and discussions with school

10 young people (0.9%) were supported to develop their skills and knowledge in a re-engagement activity

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Support from DurhamWorks Programme for Schools (DWPfs) - School Cohort

25 Year 11s, from Durham Johnston School's 22/22 cohort, received support from DurhamWorks Programme for Schools (DWPfs).

The destinations of the cohort on 1st November 2022 are as follows:

- 84.0% undertaking education, employment or training
- 4.0% taking an acceptable/temporary break in learning
- 12.0% actively seeking opportunities in education, employment or training
