Instructions for Year 10 Historians

When school closed, you were all working on the Germany: Democracy and Dictatorship topic. During the closure we expect this work to continue.

For those of you who were able to attend in the last week before school closed, textbooks were made available for you to take home. These textbooks cover much of the same material about Weimar Germany and Nazi Germany that you would have been studying in class. Read through the material and work through the activities provided in the textbook.

On the school's website we will also be making available the powerpoint presentations that are used in Mr Doyle's lessons. There are suggested activities connected to the topics that you are studying along with questions, debates and exam technique. Given the circumstances, however, you may not be able to complete all activities with the resources you have available. Consider the powerpoints a tool for supporting your learning, rather than a step by step scheme of learning.

Each section of learning is followed by an opportunity to test your knowledge, and we thoroughly recommend using these tests to identify gaps in your knowledge so that you can go back and correct your understanding.
