

Y11 LATIN Revision Guidance 2020

Divide your time between **language/literature/civilisation**. The Language paper is worth more, but your mark on it is less dependent on the revision you do at this stage.

Don't always start with the bits you are confident on - start with the bits you worry about!

Paper 1:

- Keep working on vocab - focus on tricky things like words with multiple meanings (you need to choose the right one for the context), easily confused words & irregular principal parts.
- Revise grammar - nouns & verbs, of course; pronouns are common causes of error.
- Practice - learning to deal confidently with the inevitable tricky bits is best done by just translating lots of Latin. If school is closed, this is a priority for you to work on. **Use the translation passages & practice papers in the back of the text-book to work through.**

Paper 2:

- Revise each **text** - you should be able to read them in Latin & understand them confidently without reference to your notes or the vocabulary. If there are sections you don't understand, MAKE A NOTE SO YOU CAN ASK FOR HELP.
- Make notes of **key themes** in each text (factual info about racing; attitudes to races; attitudes to fans; appeal of racing) and look for links between the texts - this will help with the essay question.
- In addition to the 2019 paper that you did as your mock, there is only one more "real" past paper from 2018. PLEASE do not look at this yet. After Easter, once you have had feedback on the mock & done some thorough revision, I will set this paper as a final practice.

Paper 3:

- Make sure you have revision notes on the **facts** about each topic.
- Read about the topic or research online – watching a documentary can count as work if it is a good quality one!
- Look over the **sources** we studied, so that you can refer to specific details to add substance to your longer answers.
- Again, there is one past paper that we have not yet used - please do not look at this until after Easter.
